## **AUTOMATED CURBSIDE COLLECTION IS HERE!**

### The Municipality of North Cowichan

is getting new waste collection trucks – a necessary step as the current trucks reach the end of their life. With new trucks came the opportunity for a new automated collection service.

Beginning in June 2025, collection trucks will use new mechanical arms to lift and empty garbage and organics carts – this change requires uniform carts to be used by all residents.

This guide will answer your questions about the new carts and the service. Keep this guide as a handy reference!

Recycling service remains as manual collection, for now.



## **Benefits of autocart collection**



#### **Protects workers**

Manual garbage collection is physically hard and causes injuries.



#### Yard waste

Your new, larger cart can include yard waste!

Start using your new carts on June 2, 2025.

## **INTRODUCING YOUR NEW CARTS**



Some people have requested larger cart sizes.

Here are those dimensions.


## **Cart exchanges**

Carts can be exchanged for a different size this fall. Larger carts have a higher fee. If you find a different size cart is needed, you can complete a cart exchange form at **northcowichan.ca/carts**.

Forms will be available beginning in fall 2025.







## **Keep clear**

Ensure the carts are not blocking sidewalks, driveways, bike or traffic lanes.

## **Download the app**

Never miss another collection day - download the MNC Curbside app from the app store or the North Cowichan website.



## **Keep on schedule**

There are no changes to vour collection schedule or set-out times.



## **Leave room**

Leave one meter (three feet) between carts and any other obstacles.

Leave three meters (10 feet) above the carts.

This leaves room for the mechanical arms to work. sidewalk or in a bike lane.



## **CUL-DE-SAC**




## **TRAFFIC LANES**

## **MORE ABOUT YOUR CARTS**



#### Bear resistant carts available

Carts with a bear-resistant gravity-locking mechanism are available, by request, at an additional cost. Interested residents can call 250-746-3106 or email operations@ northcowichan.ca for a request form (also available on the website). These carts can deter wildlife from accessing waste – but they are not 'bear-proof'. The best way to prevent wildlife conflict is to keep waste properly stored and only set it out the morning of collection day.



### Fill in the blank

Write your address with permanent marker on the white space. This can help identify your cart and ensures carts remain with the correct house.

Each cart has an RFID tag. This digital tag lets us know whose cart is whose, and ensures the right charge is applied based on the size you've chosen. Do not swap or sell your carts.

## **Damaged carts**

North Cowichan will repair lightly damaged but still usable carts at no cost to the property owner. Examples of light damage include a broken wheel or cracked lid.

- If a cart is damaged beyond repair or reported missing, North Cowichan will replace the cart.
- If damaged or missing carts are due to owner negligence, carts will be replaced at the expense of the property owner.





## MORE ABOUT YOUR SERVICE



#### **Excess items**

Ensure your cart lid can close and that everything is inside your cart. Items left beside carts will not be collected. Excess items can either be saved for the next collection day or taken to a disposal site. Additional bags with tags will no longer be accepted.



## **Assisted set-out**

Support is available for people who are physically or cognitively unable to meet the curbside set out requirements. To access this support, you will need to complete a request form and provide confirmation from a qualified physician that you are unable to meet the requirements and do not have an able-bodied person assisting in household activities. A site inspection will also be required to ensure municipal collection staff can safely provide the service. Please see the North Cowichan website for a copy of the form



## **Old collection containers**

There are many ways old waste cans can be repurposed. Consider a rain barrel, compost bin or other storage. For people who are unable or do not want to repurpose/reuse their old collection bins, North Cowichan will plan for a collection day where cans will be collected for recycling. Watch for more details in the months to come.



## **Legal suites**

Homes with legal suites have received a default 240-litre garbage and 120-litre organics cart for sharing. There are some options available for alternative cart sizes. Contact the Operations Department at 250-746-3106 or operations@northcowichan.ca for more information.
