

2025 Biannual Report January 1 to June 30 North Cowichan Fire Department

August 12, 2025 Special Council Meeting

Fire Services Administration

- Fire Services business planning was completed in preparation for the 2025-2029 Operating and Capital Budget.
- Staff continue to implement recommendations from the 2024 Tim Pley & Associates Ltd. report, North Cowichan Fire Department Review and Strategic Work Plan. Long-term recommendations will require budget approvals before adoption of the recommendations.
- Council and Fire Services Appreciation & Awards banquet will be held on October 4, 2025.
- Crofton Fire Station construction was completed. Firefighters have moved into the new section with the open house ceremony held on May 3, 2025.
- Recruitment drive (2024) was completed with 26 applications; 5 experienced firefighters, 6
 recruits, and 3 juniors in the South End, Chemainus, Crofton, and Maple Bay Fire Stations all
 started in early 2025. Ongoing training is taking place to meet the minimum training standards
 set by the Office of the Fire Commissioner.

Fire Services Administration continued

- New fire apparatus has arrived and has been placed into service at the South End Fire Station.
- Planning is in place to deliver Engine 28 to the Penelakut Island Fire Department.
- New Assistant Fire Chief, Fire Inspector hiring process is completed with anticipation of the successful candidate to start in September 2025.
- North Cowichan Fire Department registered with BC Wildfire Service for any potential request of wildfire deployment for both local and provincial response.
- Staffing of fire apparatus continues to be a challenge; Crofton, Chemainus, and Maple Bay Fire Stations have very low turnout numbers during the daytime hours.
- The department has 116 personnel; 106 in service and 11 on leave of absence. There are 13 females (11%) and 103 males (89%) in the various ranks.




Fire Services Administration continued

- North Cowichan Fire Underwriters Survey (FUS) was received late fall. Staff are reviewing
 the FUS report and will be delivering the outcomes to Council in Q4 2025. FUS provides the fire
 insurance grade for insurance rates.
- South End Fire Station continues to have the highest call volume in the Fire Department.
- Fire Services staff and personnel have developed a committee to provide a staffing plan for voluntary staffing on an Engine. This will be presented to Council for consideration in the business planning for the 2026-2030 Operating & Capital Budget.
- Fire Services staff were awarded a grant through the 2024 Community Emergency
 Preparedness Fund grant program under the Volunteer and Composite Fire
 Department Equipment and Training funding stream for wildland personal protective equipment
 and wildland firefighting equipment.
- Fire Services staff were awarded a grant administered by the Union of BC Municipalities on behalf of the Ministry of Citizens' Services in the 2025 Next Generation 911 application-based Funding program. This grant funding is for mobile data technologies equipment for the North Cowichan Fire Department.







January-June 2025: Incident calls by Fire Station




2025: Incident call totals by month
